About the position

The Bengal Experience and Transition (BEAT) Team Member position exists within the Student Leadership and Engagement office with the purpose of welcoming and acclimating new first year and transfer students to Buffalo States campus along with their family and support networks. Through a variety of experiences and opportunities, OLs have the power to make a positive and lasting difference in the Buffalo State community while developing great leadership and résumé-building skills.

BEAT Team Responsibilities

- Welcome new students and their family members to Buffalo State College during orientation programs.
- Lead groups of students (20-25) and promote interaction and community building within during the overnight orientation program.
- Facilitate ice breakers with students at various parts of the program.
- Work alongside Faculty and Staff to ensure students arrive to their scheduled programming on time.
- Lead campus tours, and identifying important campus locations for students
- Plan, set up, and execute late night programming such as game nights, dance parties, etc. to develop social connections amongst new students.
- Assist in the preparation of orientation activities and materials/perform assigned logistical tasks related to orientation activities including signage, setting up/taking down tents, tables, chairs, stuffing bags, etc.
- Participate in training activities including Spring Semester and BEAT Team retreat.
- Uphold and enforce all aspects of the colleges code of conduct.
- Other duties as assigned

Requirements

- Earn and maintain a 2.5 GPA or higher
- Enrolled as a full-time student
- Conduct records in the Student Conduct and Community Standards Office will be checked during the hiring/interview process. These records may or may not affect the final hiring decision.
- Ability to work every orientation session in June, July, and August.
- Be a positive, enthusiastic, motivated, and school spirited student.

- Public speaking and large and small group facilitation.
- Positive customer service techniques.

Compensation
